Stay Safe/Healthy Bodies

- Understand the positive effects of a healthy lifestyle
- Have a positive relationship with exercise which helps them to be healthy and active adults
- To understand healthy lifestyle choices and the benefit of a healthy and balanced diet
- To understand they can make healthy choices such as choosing not to smoke or vape
- Develop strategies to help them manage adversity
- Make responsible choices and know how to tackle adversity (DAaRT program)
- Understand how to protect themselves in a variety of situations

Diversity/Community

- View the world with tolerance and are able to form their own opinions
- Value and respect others
- Show empathy for different cultures and faiths
- Develop knowledge and understanding about other countries
- Know and enact British Values
- Develop positive attitudes, acceptance and inclusivity towards others
- Have the knowledge, opportunities and experiences they need to enable them to understand life in modern Britain
- Stand up for what is right

Aspiration/Learning

- Have a growth mind-set towards learning
- Develop enquiring minds and gain an understanding of their place in the world
- Enjoy learning and have the skills required to tackle it with confidence
- Learn to read with confidence which then enables them to access the broad curriculum
- Want to, and can, achieve well
- Can become lifelong learners who have a desire to gain new knowledge
- Are offered a range of experiences that develop their cultural capital
- Remember key information which they can apply in different contexts
- Make connections between knowledge they have gained
- Ask questions
- Want to find out more

Communication/Oracy

- Well-rounded individuals who can be articulate, independent thinkers
- Build their confidence to speak
- Support pupils' understanding of turn-taking in talk
- Support pupils' understanding of listening through partner conversations.
- Choose vocabulary carefully
- Understand the importance of listening as well as speaking
- Adapt to a variety of audiences
- Become prepared for future life opportunities such as interviews
- Consider tone and body language
- Speak to unfamiliar people with real purpose e.g. asking questions to a museum curator or having a conversation with a visitor in the classroom.
